

You're being pitched AI. Here's what each vendor actually delivers.

Three categories of AI vendor. One of them builds a system that works for you on day one.

	"AI Platform" Vendor <i>Gives you a tool. You do the work.</i>	"AI Consultant" <i>Gives you advice. You find someone to build it.</i>	Brainverse <i>Deploys a working team. Your workflow runs on day one.</i>
What you get on day one	A login to a chatbot interface. A training video library. A credit allocation.	A discovery session. A readiness assessment. A maturity scorecard.	A deployed team of AI agents working on your highest-priority workflow. Producing output. Today.
Who builds the agents?	You do. Their platform has "no-code builders." Your team learns to configure them.	Nobody. They tell you what to build. You hire someone else to do it.	We do. Custom-built for your workflows, your data, your team. Deployed and running.
What happens at Month 6?	Your power users have built a few workflows. Everyone else forgot their login. You're paying credits for a tool 20% of your team uses.	You have a binder full of recommendations. Maybe you've hired a contractor to start. Months into a journey with no working system.	Your agent team has run daily improvement cycles for 5 months. The system is measurably better than the day it was deployed. No additional work from your team.
What you're actually paying for	Monthly subscription plus credits that run out. You're renting access to a chatbot.	Hourly billing for advice. Workshops at \$5K-15K each. Implementation is extra, and it's not them.	Flat fee. One workflow addressed. Working system delivered. Optional retainer for continuous improvement.
Does it get better over time?	Only if your team keeps building new agents. The platform doesn't improve itself.	Only if you keep hiring them back. Their deliverable is static.	Yes. Autonomous improvement cycles run daily. Every day the system runs, it gets better at your work.
If you cancel, what do you keep?	Nothing. The agents live on their platform. Your credits expire.	A stack of PDFs and slide decks.	Everything. The agents, the memory, the workflows. It's your system.
